

Why City On A Hill Does Medical Clinics?

Matthew 5:14 *'You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.'*

The need for the clinic- As servants of Jesus Christ we want to display to the world, what Christ has done for us, as we serve others, showing them the love of Christ and making 'real' the gospel that we speak to them in word. This need includes meeting physical needs (attending to the sick with care and medications, food, services), but goes beyond meeting the physical. We must attend to the spiritual needs of this community, to be the light of the world means that we must be about 'proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ' that saves from sin, brings freedom from bondage and joy to the believer.

Our mission- *Which is the mission of the church in the world, to be a witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ, to proclaim that Jesus is Lord and Savior and announce God's invitation to enter into life by turning to Christ in repentance for sin and through faith in Jesus and His work alone. So we are to proclaim the gospel and teach people, in all nations, to trust in Jesus, to become a disciple of Christ, and to be conformed to His image. (Matt 28:19-20, Matt 24:14, Mark 13:10, Luke 24:47)*

Mercy and Compassion- *True acts of mercy and compassion, were never divorced from the Gospel message in the new testament, but rather accompanied the Gospel. (Matt 25:34-40, Luke 10:25-37) Our greatest model is Jesus himself, who healed the sick, fed the hungry and taught the people with compassion. (Matt 15:32, Matt 20:34, Mark 1:41, Mark 10:1)*

Our attitudes as servants- *To genuinely display the beauty of Jesus Christ as His ambassadors showing love through acts of compassion, we are never to be arrogant. So, when someone we are serving is rude or short tempered, we are to remain loving and compassionate. When someone is 'rough around the edges' and comes off gruff or mean, we respond in love, knowing that the love and Gospel of Jesus Christ can change the most wicked sinner and turn them into a beautiful creature, out of the ugliness. So we must be on our guard to not be offended, to always watch our behavior, so that we are 'Jesus Christ' to everyone we serve. When we are insulted we instead love. (1 Corinthians 13:4-7, Matthew 10:24-25)*

The Gospel changes- *The Gospel is our hope which does not disappoint. In the Bible we can see how individual sinners can be changed, transformed into the image of God. Whole societies can likewise be changed, when a movement of God ensues and a whole region turns to please God through the transforming work of the Gospel of Christ. This is the hope that we hold that our community and region can change through the Gospel of Jesus Christ. (Romans 5:2, 4-5, 1 Corinthians 6:9-11, Ephesians 2:2-3, Titus 3:3)*

GUIDE LINES FOR OUR CLINICS EVERYONE NEEDS TO KNOW:

1. Please arrive at clinic location by 10:10am am the day of the Clinic
 2. Please park in the directed parking for volunteers.
 3. Please dress in a modest respectful way appropriate for the weather. (Wear a t-shirt representing your church if you have one!)
 4. Lunch will be provided for volunteers
 5. Childcare will be provided for Volunteer's children if needed, but please make sure your child will be able to stay in the designated area for the duration of the clinic.

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The Advocates Mission: The Advocate loves on, prays with, and personally shares their testimony of the gospel to the family they are assigned at the clinic.

An advocate is a regular Christian (not a super hero Christian, lol) who they assign to each family that comes through the clinic to stay with them during the duration of their time there. **The advocate role is the most significant role in the clinic. This person loves on, prays with, and personally shares their testimony of the gospel to the family they are assigned at the clinic.** An advocate does not need to be a preacher, pastor or professional minister--just a Christ follower that is willing to be bold to share their faith in Christ and love on those that come for care.

Practical Ways The Advocate Helps Their Assigned Family.

1. *They stay with their family the entire time they are at the clinic.*
2. *They help their family fill out the registration forms.*
3. *They help their family manage their children at the clinic (suggesting child care option while they wait)*
4. *They help their family get from Registration to every station they need service from*
5. *They help their family by praying with them, loving on them, and sharing their testimony of Christ to them.*
6. *They invite their family to join them at their church on Sunday morning or to attend the City on a Hill Sunday Morning Worship Service at 10:30am.*

How To Start Evangelism Conversation From The Registration Form:

THREE NEW QUESTIONS ON REGISTRATION FORM

1. Are you a Christ Follower?
2. Have you been active in a church in the last 6 months?
3. What is one thing that keeps you from coming to Church?

#1 Address the question & define what it means to be a “Christ-follower”.

Christ Follower vs Christian.

Difference between someone who “wears a label” and actually “follows Christ”.

A Christ Follower is **NOT** someone who has just said a prayer to accept Jesus or someone who was raised in church.

Definition:

But someone who LIVES according to the teachings of Jesus in the Bible & actively practices a daily relationship with Jesus that requires them to **Repent, Forgive, & Change** their daily life & choices according to what the Bible teaches.

A Christ Follower Is A Person Who Has A Personal Relationship With Jesus Christ That Affects Every Area Of Their Life.

** They believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, who died for their personal sins that separated them from God, and that Christ rose from the dead to offer them freedom from the bondage of sin & eternal life in heaven with Christ. Romans 10:8-10*

#2 Share your personal testimony of Coming to Christ & how it has affected your daily life.

#3 Inquire more about the reasons they listed that kept them from attending church.

#4 Encourage them in their faith & circumstance if they are engaged in church & an actual Christ follower.



Guest Registration Form FAITH RESPONSE

The Cross

In the upper right corner of the guest registration form we would like for you to see the small box marked (gospel). Use the following guidelines to mark the box:

Option One: If you share your journey to faith and the gospel with the guest turn the symbol into a cross. **t**

Option Two: If the guest expresses non-interest or disdain to hear the gospel. Put a large X through the box. All their needs will continue to be met regardless of their openness to hear the Word. We are bridge builders and want the guest to feel safe enough to come back in the future. **X**

Option Three: If the guest accepts Christ anytime during the day, cross the cross and decorate the box with hearts, stars, flowers, and balloons. Make the box stand out. Finally, as the advocate proceeds through the day assisting their guest in getting their needs met, show the registration form to providers. This allows providers to know at a glance where the guest is on their spiritual journey and

offers opportunities for providers to celebrate with guests who have accepted Christ at the clinic! **☞ t ✨**
